ORGANIZER

The short course is organized by Master of Science in Health Services Management, JC School of Public Health and Primary Care, The Chinese University of Hong Kong.

PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

To provide training including public health perspectives and skills necessary to assume effective leadership in public health practice, reflecting the three domains of health improvement, health protection and health service quality.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A bachelor's degree preferably in medicine or an approved related field. For non-professional degree holders, honours not lower than second class are required.

TEACHING FACULTY

- Courses will be taught by the academic staff, and the affiliated local and international staff, of JC School of Public Health and Primary Care.
- To meet the multi-disciplinary demands of the curriculum, JCSPHPC engages teaching staff from local faculties of nursing, economics, law, pharmacy, business, journalism, geography, and social sciences. We also engage outside experts and collaborate extensively with stakeholders in public health practice, such as the Department of Health, Hospital Authority, Food and Environmental Hygiene Department, and other public institutions.
- JCSPHPC will continue to capitalise on its long established network of international schools of public health (e.g. Johns Hopkins University; University of Oxford; London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine; Peking University; and Fudan University), as well as an extension network of public health institutions such as the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (US CDC), Chinese Centre for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC China), Shenzhen CDC, Bureau of Health of Shenzhen Municipality, and British Columbia Centre for Disease Control (BC CDC) of Canada.

LANGUAGE

English will be used as the language for instruction.

HSYS5012 Human Resource Management

Course Coordinator: Prof. CT Hung

(3 credits)

Course Description

This course aims to introduce the major issues and concepts of human resource management in the healthcare setting, so as to develop students' capabilities in analyzing and solving related problems to achieve system or organizational objectives. Working experience in healthcare and some knowledge of how the local health system operates would help understanding of the topics discussed in class. 3 years working experience is preferable.

Learning Outcomes/Objectives

Student should be able to:

1. Understand the strategic significance and major aspects of human resource management in relation to achieving healthcare objectives
2. Understand the nature and behaviour of health professionals and their implications on management
3. Apply the principles of manpower planning, recruitment, compensation and retention to ensure proper provision of human resources
4. Apply appropriate principles of motivation, teamwork and performance management to achieve organizational and personal goals
5. Understand the legal and ethical principles of human resource management practices to protect staff and the organization

HSYS5013 Financial Management

Course Coordinator: Prof. Nancy Tse

(2 credits)

Course Description

This course focuses on essential competencies of health services managers to understand, interpret and manage financial resources. It covers basic knowledge and concepts in Management Accounting and Financial Management. Topics include basic accounting principles, financial statements and their interpretation, financial performance, risks and corporate governance, budget planning and management, costing and benchmarking, financing of healthcare services, financial decision making, and common pitfalls.

Learning Outcomes/Objectives

Student should be able to:

1. Develop sufficient familiarity and understanding of basic concepts of financial management in health care organizations
2. Be cognizant of the need for competent financial management in managing health care services
3. Be aware of tools and techniques that can be used for financial management
4. Have a good understanding of the role of finance managers in the health care organization and be able to evaluate the performances

Course Description

This advanced course in healthcare financing is an extension of HSYS5005 (Healthcare Financing). It provides an in-depth focus on specialized topics, including: financing for primary care, cancer care, ageing populations, and innovative models, with practical case studies and future-focused strategies.

Learning Outcomes/Objectives

Student should be able to:

1. Understand advanced healthcare financing models for primary care, cancer care, and ageing populations.
2. Analyze challenges and opportunities in financing healthcare systems with a focus on equity and efficiency.
3. Explore innovative financing methods, including digital payment systems, telemedicine, and AI applications.
4. Examine the role of public vs private financing in Hong Kong's healthcare system.
5. Develop strategies to align healthcare financing with Universal Health Coverage and sustainability goals.
